





Ontario Officials Code of Ethics

- Each official shall follow and enforce the laws and procedures as outlined in the OBA Officiating handbook, in accordance with the IBF Statute Book.
- An official shall be dressed in proper attire according to the OBA Dress Policy and present a meticulous appearance.
- An official shall remember that while at work as an official it is important to act in such a way that attention is drawn not to the official but to the players.
- 4. An official shall shape his/her character and conduct so as to be a worthy example to players who play under his/her jurisdiction.
- An official shall be fair and unbiased in all decisions, rendering them without regard to the score.
- 6. The actions of an official should be firm, but not overbearing; courteous but not ingratiating; positive but never rude; dignified but never arrogant; friendly but not companionable; and calm but always alert.
- An official shall be prepared both physically and mentally to administer the game.
- An official shall be constantly alert to the possibility of player injury, so that an injured player may be properly treated.
- An official shall act towards fellow officials in a courteous and correct manner at al times and never in a critical manner in public.
- **10.** An official shall act towards coaches in a correct and courteous manner at all times.
- 11. An official shall offer an explanation, if requested, after declaring a call to players. Furthermore, the official shall not give the appearance of obvious familiarity before, during or after a match.
